## **PK4 Curriculum Overview**

The PK4 program uses play and child-centered experiences to integrate and facilitate academic development. Four year olds are curious by nature, and our curriculum capitalizes on their readiness and enthusiasm to learn about the world around them. While students grow as readers and writers, the literacy program emphasizes phonics, syllable sound awareness, and an introduction to sight words. Rich language experiences include a student created picture dictionary, journaling, and puppet play. Book and print awareness are developed through a print rich classroom environment and daily readalouds. "Handwriting Without Tears" teaches proper pencil grip and uppercase letter formation. Mathematics concentrates on number sense up to twenty, patterning, numeral writing, and graphing. Social development stresses problem solving, manners, sharing, kindness, and independence. Children in both the full and half-day program benefit from special area teachers in Music, Physical Education, Christian Education, Spanish, and Computer Lab. Classroom iPads allow children to practice pre-reading and math skills.

Students and parents alike enjoy cherished PK4 traditions. The "Pow Wow" is the culmination of a social studies unit on Native Americans. "Dino Day" celebrates a lengthy science prehistoric exploration, while "Mothers' Day Tea" is simply a fun time for our children to perform for and host their mothers. This creative, stimulating, and fun year of growth in PK4 fully prepares our children for the Kindergarten program that awaits.
