

St. Mark's Wins the Caruso Cup for Second Consecutive Year!



For the second time in school history, the St. Mark's Lions athletic program has won the Caruso Cup. Named in honor of Palm Beach Independent School Athletic Conference (PBISAC) founder Steve Caruso, the cup is presented annually to the school who accumulates the most points during league play throughout the year. The point system is based on league championships and playoff appearances.

The Lions path to the cup during the 2016-17 school year was powered by two league championships, flag football and volleyball; as well as a host of playoff victories, runner-up in both girls' and boys' lacrosse; semi-finals in boys' basketball, girls' soccer, and boys' soccer; and first round loss in girls' basketball. The PBISAC consists of St. Mark's, Benjamin, King's Academy, Jupiter Christian, Rosarian Academy, Palm Beach Day School and Meyer Academy. In the history of the Caruso Cup, this is the second time a school other than the Benjamin Buccaneers has earned the award.
